## ETHICAL ISSUE

Coaching and working the floor with the many demands of the profession, families, students and faculty sometimes a quick short cut or improvising seemed appropriate. Sadly, the consequences are that the student picked up on the minor short cut or work around.

The simple work arounds or short cuts that are generated to get everything done concept. This in turn will have the student learn to do the short cut and simply do not realize that the preceptor, teacher or coach knows in their minds what to double check for or what key step is not being done. The student NOT knowing this will perform the procedure following the short cut and eventually will cost the patient their life because the student just did not know what was left out of the activity or procedure that was to occur.
