Those who registered to attend in-person will be given the option to attend virtually or be offered a full refund.

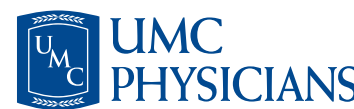

**NEW DRUG UPDATE 2026: WHAT’S HOT AND WHAT’S NOT**  
**PRESENTED BY:** Wendy L. Wright, DNP, ANP-BC, FNP-BC, FAANP, FAAN, FNAF

**PURPOSES/GOALS**  
To educate health care providers regarding newly released medications and to discuss the side effects, risks, benefits and indications of each.

One in every three individuals with diabetes has CKD. This session will focus on the latest recommendations for screening and the pharmacologic agents which can delay, slow or prevent CKD in patients with Type 2 diabetes.

- + Detect and recognize CKD in patients with reduced kidney function, including in early stages of disease.
- + Implement screening for albuminuria in patients with diabetes in clinical practice to identify CKD as early as possible.
- + Initiate therapy with evidence-based therapies, including newer agents, for patients with CKD when indicated.

**PURPOSES/GOALS**  
This session uses primary care vignettes to enhance clinical reasoning, diagnostic accuracy and decision-making, covering assessments, differential diagnoses, diagnostic tests and evidence-based management, including pharmacologic plans. Cases include abdominal pain, heart murmur (pediatric and geriatric), complicated UTI and workplace conflicts.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- + Identify differential diagnoses for chief complaints.
- + Select assessments and diagnostics to refine the list.
- + Create a management plan with pharmacologic interventions for the working or confirmed diagnosis.

**PURPOSES/GOALS**

**PURPOSES/GOALS**  
Autoimmune disorders can be elusive, often masquerading as common conditions. This session helps nurse practitioners sharpen their clinical acumen by identifying hallmark symptoms, selecting appropriate diagnostics and differentiating among autoimmune subtypes. Once diagnosis is identified, an evidence-based plan of action will be implemented.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- + Identify signs, symptoms and risk factors of autoimmune diseases in primary care.
- + Choose diagnostic labs and imaging.
- + Differentiate autoimmune subtypes by presentation and criteria.
- + Implement evidence-based management.
- + Coordinate specialist care and ongoing patient support.

**PURPOSES/GOALS**  
This session covers asthma diagnosis and management, allergy intersections, treatment approaches and interventions, emphasizing control, prevention and patient self-management to improve long-term outcomes.
